



IF you are seeking a school that champions inclusion, differentiation, and the holistic development of students academically, socially, and emotionally, Gladstone South State School is the place for you.

Our commitment to personalised learning employs a range of strategies to ensure each student maximises their potential. At Gladstone South, we cultivate students who are South S.M.A.R.T: Safe, Motivated, possessing an A+ Attitude, Respectful, and Trustworthy.

Our motto, "Our Best Always," reflects our dedication to nurturing every aspect of our students' growth in a supportive and caring environment.

Commitment to wellbeing

ST Ursula's College, Yeppoon, the only all-girls Catholic boarding and day secondary college in Central Queensland, is committed to providing a holistic, comprehensive, faith-filled educational experience to girls in Years 7-12. College Principal Deborah Ryan said that in response to continued growth and capacity development, the College's leadership team expanded from four to six positions from the commencement of 2024.

"We created a new position, assistant principal – mission and identity, to ensure St Ursula's educational environment reflects the mission, values and goals of the College and its strategic plan," Mrs Ryan said.

"The role of deputy principal –students and wellbeing, was reconfigured to meet the pastoral needs of students and their families.

"This includes the ongoing promotion and delivery of wellbeing programs with a focus on the social-emotional learning of students.

"Key staff members (head of junior school, College counsellor and inclusive education coordinator) attended a four-day training workshop in the Berry Street Education Model (BSEM) in order to implement this into Year 7 classrooms in 2024.

"Student engagement has benefitted from the implementation of the BSEM; our Year 7 students particularly enjoy the 'brain breaks' each day which promote sustained focus during a lesson," Mrs Ryan said.

The College's Parent Engagement Network (formerly Parents

and Friends Association) complements St Ursula's holistic approach to wellbeing through the funding of a subscription to SchoolTV, accessible to all families.

"SchoolTV is a platform which provides an extensive range of Wellbeing resources for parents and students," Mrs Ryan said.

"We are grateful to our Parent Engagement Network for recognising the importance of parents' active involvement in their daughter's education and wellbeing, and that parents and carers are an integral part of the College community.

Biloela State High School's vision is to foster success and individual pathways for every student.


Jaimee's success has been celebrated by Racing QLD appearing on television and radio. Jaimee is the first school-based Jockey apprentice to have multiple wins in her name.

With a clear plan for continued development in place, we are excited to see our facilities evolve, most recently with the commencement of the O’Keeffe Technology Centre. This purpose-built building will house industry-standard equipment, machinery and new technologies to provide our students with the skills to transition into trades, tertiary education and emerging industries.



The journey to Emmaus

He then disappears, prompting them to hurriedly return to Jerusalem and share the “Good News” that they have met the risen Jesus and how their hearts had burned as they spoke with him on the road.

As a college we celebrate the Emmaus story over a three-year cycle where we celebrate “Walk with Us”, “Stay with Us – and Eat” and “Share the Good News with hearts burning.”

The annual musical production embodies Emmaus College’s commitment to professionalism, excellence, inclusion, and the celebration of the diverse talents within our community.


It is an enormous effort by the college to put this production on annually, but our college would not be the same without it.
