

# Welcoming in a new era

This year the Boyne Tannum HookUp celebrates its 29th year of bringing together family, friends, sponsors, businesses, community groups and supporters from across Australia to enjoy our magnificent community event showcasing the Gladstone Region as a premier fishing location. Australia's Biggest Family Fishing Competition 2024 will offer its BIGGEST PRIZE POOL EVER with over \$450,000 worth of prizes to be won across the three-day weekend.

The Boyne Tannum HookUp Association is a not-for-profit organisation with a management committee who works tirelessly all year long to deliver this professional and prestigious event for the Gladstone Region. We are grateful for the support from our 53 amazing sponsors to make the 2024 HookUp event possible, especially our Platinum Sponsor, the Gladstone Regional Council. The HookUp creates opportunities for our 20 community group partners to raise money for their worthy organisations all while promoting the Boyne Tannum area.

Following our 2023 event Key Learnings, the HookUp management committee agreed to put a focus on saying thank you to the anglers who participate and sustainable fishing.

**At the 2024 event you will notice a few new things, including:**

- We wanted to give back to the anglers and participants and so our prize pool reflects just that.
- 16 eligible fish species, reintroduction of the Black Jewfish to the Non-Live fish category.
- Flathead and Grunter species being moved from the Live fish category to a Live Catch and Release category.
- So there are now four Live Catch and Release species, Barramundi, Flathead, Grunter,

Salmon (Blue Threadfin and King Threadfin)

- Brand new inaugural Ladies Fish and Sip sessions – just for the ladies who want to learn to fish and have an enjoyable time doing so!

We saw an increase in fish weigh-ins at our Gladstone satellite weigh-in station last year and we will once again offer weigh-in stations at Bray Park and the Gladstone Main VMR Boat Ramp.

Junior and Senior anglers compete in the fishing competition to win daily and overall cash prizes totalling over \$18,000 along with overall angler trophies, fishing charters and the major prize angler boats. We have created the Elite Angler – Largest Fish prize for the event. The Elite Angler prize will be awarded to one angler who weighs-in the largest fish during the three-day competition. This can be a senior or junior angler, male or female. The Elite Angler prize winner will receive a \$1,000 cash prize, plus a charter prize and trophy.

Those anglers putting together a team have the chance to win an amazing Heron Island holiday prize and one lucky family will win the \$1,000 Pat O'Reilly Memorial Family Tri-fecta. To all those anglers fishing at the beautiful Lake Awoonga, keep an eye out for the three tagged barramundi worth \$5,000 each if caught during the HookUp weekend!

If you're not a keen angler (or may not have luck catching anything) and would rather enjoy the event from inside the park, there's still plenty of prizes to win just for buying a ticket. We will have three nights of promotional prize draws featuring the Senior 590 Sea Jay Titan Boat valued at over \$112,000, junior, and senior boats, tackle combos, junior bikes and more.

You will have until 3pm on Sunday, 5 May 2024 to purchase your tickets to win.

On top of the great fishing and prizes, there will be heaps of activities for the whole family to enjoy across the weekend, including food and drinks, free kid's activities and fishing lessons, the Boyne Island McDonald's Junior Lure Throwing Competition, rides, and live music. The event will finish with a bang as we light up the sky over the Boyne River on Sunday night with the region's best fireworks.

Get out there this May Day long weekend with your family and mates to enjoy fishing and taking in all that the Boyne Tannum HookUp has to offer.

# More prizes up for grabs

At this year's Boyne Tannum HookUp the committee is aiming to give more back to the anglers.

In 2024 the prize pool has grown to over \$450,000 in prizes and cash, including the major prize of the Seajay 590 Titan Samurai Hull with a 150hp Yamaha outboard and Outta Range marine electronics fitout worth over \$112,000.

Nine additional Seajay tinnies will also be up for grabs, complete with the Yamaha outboards.

But the prize that will be on every anglers' minds on Sunday will be the inaugural Elite Angler award.

The Elite Angler prize will be awarded to one angler who weighs-in the largest fish during the three-day competition.

This can be a senior or junior angler, male or female with the winner receiving a \$1,000 cash prize, plus a charter prize and trophy.

There's also \$20,000 cash to be won across the weekend including \$100 per winning fish category and \$300 for each overall winner of the species.

With 100s of rods and reels combos up for grabs there's plenty to win this year at the HookUp.

## HOW TO CLAIM:

### Fishing competition prizes:

To claim the fishing competition category prizes, the winner must be in Bray Park, Boyne Island; however, they do not need to adhere to the 2-minute timer.

If no entrant can be identified, then the prize will not be awarded at the event. For example: if no one catches a tagged Barramundi at Lake Awoonga.

Prize winners will be required to present

their electronic/printed ticket and formal identification to claim their prize.

Accepted forms of identification for junior prize winners are their student ID or other formal identification; if they do not have their own ID then they need to be accompanied by a parent or carer with their formal identification and the junior's electronic or printed ticket.

### Promotional prizes

To claim the promotional prizes, the winner must be in Bray Park, Boyne Island and make themselves known to the HookUp Management Committee or the master of ceremony on stage within the two-minute timer to claim their prize; otherwise, it will be redrawn until a winner is identified within a two-minute period.

Prize winners will be required to present their electronic or printed ticket and formal identification to claim their prize.

For entertainment purposes only, the promotional prize draws will be live streamed from 6pm each evening and can be watched on the links contained on the HookUp's website, Facebook live stream and YouTube.

# Thirty years in the making

Over 30 years ago, a young and energetic Darryl Branthwaite started discussions with local business people around Boyne Island and Tannum Sands about bringing a premier fishing competition to the region.

They discussed this idea and many more, calibrated and made it happen. With Zach Simmons, Paul Simmons, Ned Beaumont, Don Collier and Robyn Shepherd, the first committee for Boyne Tannum HookUp was formed and in 1995, the event was born.

"It was created by the Boyne Tannum and Bernerby Chamber of Commerce way back in 1993, 94 and 95," Mr Branthwaite said.

"The idea was to try and give Boyne Tannum an event it could call its own and be proud of.

"It showcased our lifestyle and our small businesses.

"It was one of those things to drive visitation with the seasonality of Central Queensland and the coast here.

"The grey nomads were passing through our region so it was ideal to keep them here."

The Boyne Tannum HookUp has since become the largest fishing competition in Australia and each year since its inception it has attracted over 3000 entrants in the competition, over 10,000 people in attendance each night of the event at Bray Park and millions of dollars in prizes.

"I think it is amazing that it is still going," Mr Branthwaite said.

"It has changed a fair bit but it's still going, which is really good for our community."

The formula for success stems from the incredible volunteers who work hard each year

to hold the iconic annual event.

Which has led to a consistent strong number of anglers as well as sponsors and supporters.

The Boyne Tannum HookUp life member also had some tips for those chasing the big fish, including the new elite angler prize.

"Bigger hooks, bigger baits means bigger fish," Mr Branthwaite said.

"The pressure zones of the reef where the weather faces on to it, those sorts of places."

"Look for bumps on the bottom, look for structures with trees or rocks fallen over."



# Advice and tips for you

Boyne Tannum HookUp Association vice president James Moore has handed out some major advice for those chasing the big ones at this year's event.

A full list featuring every species across the three separate categories has been meticulously thought through and is now available for those who seek the advice.

The biggest fish on the list come off-shore of course with a few extremely tempting places outside boasting the monsters of the deep.

At Outer Rock, Pancake Creek, there's plenty of the sought after Spanish Mackerel waiting to be reeled in.

Most years the Spanish Mackerel is the fish that drops jaws as it's weighed in at Bray Park, and for those chasing that rush it will be ideal to slowly troll large wolf herring or gar fish.

The best place to pick the Spanish Mackerel up is in nice and clean water and before you know it you will have an incredible fight on your hands.

The always impressive Red Emperors can certainly be found at Dougal Shoals within the deep water.

Moore's advice is to look out for isolated bommies, promising the better fish are usually found on them, while using a Hussar fillet for bait.

Over at the 12 Mile Reef, a whole squid on gang hooks is your best option if you're aiming to pick up the mighty snapper.

Make sure to fish the ledges in the early morning hours for your best chance.

Inside the confines of the Calliope River is the elusive Mangrove Jack which can be a prize

for any keen angler.


Live mullet is your best bet while casting deep into rock bars but make sure to tighten the drag and hold on for an incredible fight.

Prawns are an ideal bait for a number of fish including Yellowfin and Pikey Bream, both found in the Boyne River, Black Jewfish and Grunter.

Although make sure those prawns used are ones designed for fishing and not from the supermarket.

For those anglers not keen to run with bait the iconic Awoonga Dam barramundi, King threadfin Salmon, Flathead and Grunters can all be reeled in using a range of different tackle.

|                                 | <b>Fingermark (Golden Snapper)</b>   | Rocky outcrops in Gladstone harbour | Look for schooling herring on fish finder. Use mullet, herring or lures resemble that these types of bait                |


