Emmaus College is prolific within the sporting scene, including over 80 competing teams throughout a variety of sports that compete in local, state and national competitions including:

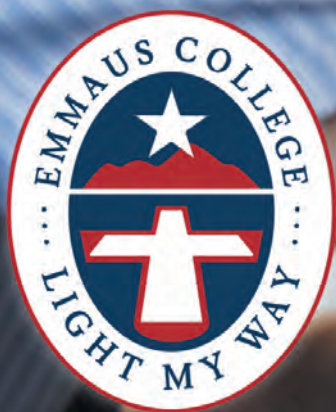

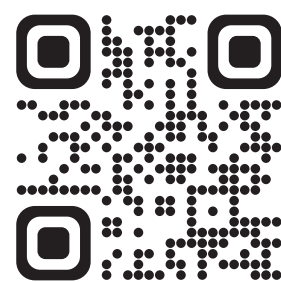

A strong legacy of faith

CATHOLIC Education – Diocese of Rockhampton offers a faith-based, holistic education across 10 Kindergartens, 31 Primary Schools and eight colleges in centres from Bundaberg to Mackay, and west to Longreach.

Characterised by a clear Catholic identity, where faith development through the religious life of the school community is central to daily learning, a Catholic education provides opportunities for students to grow in their knowledge and understanding of the person of Jesus and of a God who loves them unconditionally.

Well-resourced, technologically enabled facilities support engaging and high-quality learning experiences in an environment that provides care beyond the curriculum and focuses on the overall wellbeing and safety of our students.

Qualified, dedicated staff work to ensure students achieve to the best of their abilities and develop as confident and capable young women and men who can make a positive contribution to their communities.

Catholic schools in the Diocese of Rockhampton aim to nurture a sense of belonging within their communities and work closely with families to support young people on their educational journey and in choosing pathways.

From humble beginnings to the vibrant and successful education facilities we see today, Catholic Education has had a

strong presence in the Rockhampton community for 162 years.

Historical records show the first Catholic school opened in Rockhampton in 1863, and Rev Dean Charles Murlay from Southern France and Miss Bridget Ennis, a trained teacher from Ireland, were responsible for the opening of this school. The infants' and girls' school opened in Alma Street, Rockhampton, and the boys' school in West Street in 1868.

Faint traces survive, suggesting that there may have been small lay schools in other centres as well.

The story of Catholic Education, not only in Rockhampton but across the vast Diocese, is one of courage, sacrifice, struggle and vision — a story of commitment and, above all, of faith and trust in God.

Scanning the archival records, we read in awe of how priests, religious, parents and lay educators battled tirelessly in some of the most difficult conditions and often against all the odds to provide children of successive generations with an opportunity to acquire knowledge of the world and to be always mindful of the call of Jesus and the Mission of the wider Church.

Catholic Education continues to support local communities today, not only through education, but also through the genuine extension of support that has been provided to local families and the wider community.

From those humble beginnings back in 1863, 31 primary schools, eight colleges, as well as kindergartens in various centres across the Diocese, now provide educational opportunities based on a strong Catholic ethos to families from Bundaberg to Mackay and west to Longreach.

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Enriching opportunities

ENRICHMENT opportunities at St Ursula’s College, Yeppoon, are specifically designed to challenge those who demonstrate strong academic potential and a passion for learning.

Focused on critical thinking, design thinking, and problem solving, St Ursula’s deputy principal learning and innovation Luke Tree said enrichment opportunities aimed to extend students while preparing them for future study.

“Enrichment programs encourage independent thought and build skills essential to the 21st century,” Mr Tree said.

“In 2022, we commenced Thinking Big, our enrichment elective subject available to students in Years 9 and 10, to meet an identified need for students in our Middle School.”

College head of humanities Mark Avery said Thinking Big supported a synergy of creative and critical thinking while promoting student agency in their learning.

“Students thrive when given the chance to think critically, creatively, and beyond the boundaries of the traditional classroom,” Mr Avery said.

“In Year 9, Thinking Big involves researching in depth, writing in academic form to clarify arguments, and then curating learning into physical displays for a public audience.

“Our Year 10s focus on public speaking, developing rhetorical style and presence.”

Current Year 12 students, Nevaeh, Ella, and Sophie, said undertaking Thinking Big in their middle school years provided a head start in academic-style research and critical thinking.

“Thinking Big gave us the freedom to choose our own topics for study and then encouraged us to delve deeply into the areas of interest,” Sophie said.

“It makes the idea of university study a lot less daunting because of the research and academic writing needed for assignments in Thinking Big,” Nevaeh said.

“For me, it really helped with my public speaking skills,” Ella said.

“Learning about tone and presence for your audience while presenting something you are passionate about was a very good challenge and pushed me out of my comfort zone in the best way.”
